

Initial, Mid-Year, Final High School transcripts Keep students posted on important dates and deadlines Apprise students of scholarship opportunities Students may participate in home high school extracurricular activities as long as they schedule classes to permit Students still can participate in their home school graduation ceremony

Seniors have the opportunity to attend senior activities (prom, grad night, etc.)


